

PURPOSE

The mission of **The SPOT** is to provide an environment where LGBTQA youth can feel accepted and empowered and where sexual and gender identity can be embraced without fear of violence, harassment or judgment. The group promotes understanding and respect for all through education, support, advocacy, creative expression, and friendship.

DID YOU KNOW?

- ▼ 92% of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender students in middle and high school report that they frequently or often hear homophobic remarks from their peers.
- ▼ Attempted suicide rates are over four times higher for lesbian, gay, and bisexual students; 33% report that they attempted suicide during the past year, compared with only 9% of all other students.
- ▼ Lesbian, gay, and bisexual students (16%) are twice as likely to have skipped school in the last month for safety concerns as other students (8%).

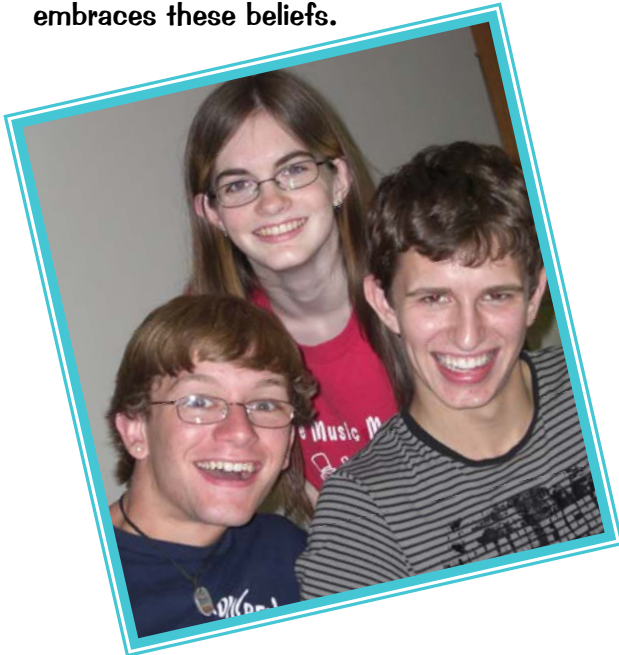

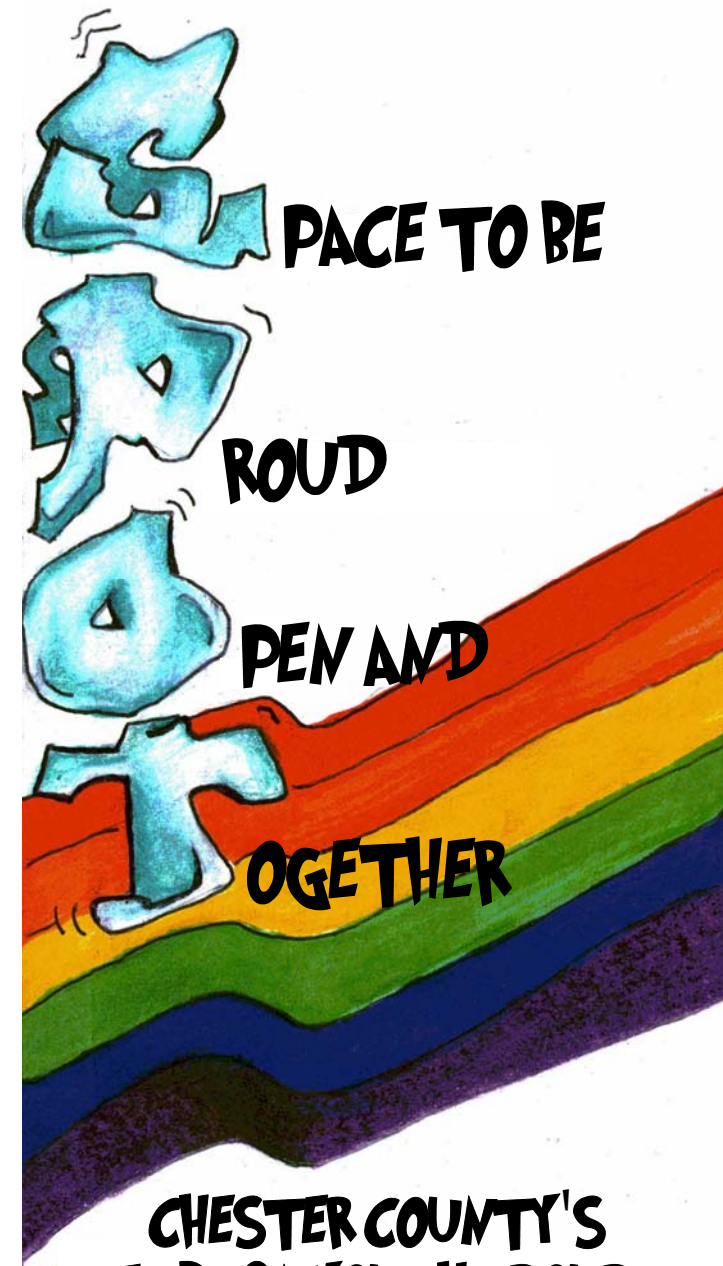
